WEDNESDAY 5th JUNE CLUB NIGHT – VIVIEN WITHERS WORKSHOP "SUMMER COTTAGE GARDEN"

In June we are all looking forward to rolling up our sleeves and enjoying Viven's workshop. Vivien will demonstrate one arrangement in foam and one using chicken wire.

It will then be over to all of us to give it a go! Things to bring to the workshop are:

Summer flowers together with a suitable container such as a favourite dish or vase (well wrapped). You can make your arrangement in pre-soaked floral form or using chicken wire taped into the container. Suitable flowers include Roses, Delphiniums, Eryngiums (Thistles), Alstroemeria, Dianthus (Carnations), Antirrhinum, Peonies and Mathiola (Stocks).

Please also bring along well conditioned (cut and given a drink for ideally at least 24 hours before arranging) garden foliage. Here are some suggestions - Ivy, Spotted Laurel (Aucuba), Portuguese Laurel, Strawberry Tree, Hebe, Fatsia leaves, Bergenia leaves, Phormiums and Eucalyptus".

Vivien will be on hand to give help and guidance.



Kettle Challenge Cup awarded for best exhibit in lasses 180-183.


Astley Beer Cup- Judges choice from any class- the exhibit the judge would like to take home. Claygate Floral Club for the highest amount of prize money across all classes.
